I can't believe that, as I type, the day would come when I'd be writing a newsletter! Never in my wildest dreams could I have imagined that I would be working in a Christian non-profit organization and among other Christians serving churches, global ministries, and soon-to-be followers of Jesus. It was most certainly not in my mind when I came to the US in 2022 to study at the University of Minnesota. In fact, I had quite a different plan and was keeping my professional life separate from my faith life. However, all-the-while I was quietly surrendering and whispering to God, "Give me life worth living." Now, here I am, trying to put together this letter to tell you how unexpected events (completely within our all-knowing Father's purposes) challenged me and have awesomely blessed our family.

If you are receiving this letter, it's because you have touched my heart and it reflects your importance to me. I want to deeply thank those of you who sharpened, corrected, blessed and loved me. I want to keep in contact with you and invite you to continue to pray for me and my family as we journey together.

God's Plan: Several years ago, God spoke through my mother indicating that I would leave Mongolia and go to "another land." While my mother gently advised me, my young son was also determined that we go back to the states where we had lived in 2014-2016. Then, just two weeks after telling me her prediction my mother sadly passed away. Four months after her passing, I faced another difficult event: I now had two children to raise on my own. God used Psalm 23 to guide, comfort and ground me. Through prayer and processing, God grew me in faith and drew me closer to himself.

It took three more tough years before my mother's prediction became reality. In 2022 my two children and I moved to "another land" beautiful Minnesota. Coming here wasn't easy, I must say. I said goodbye to all my beloved people, including my dear father. He passed away in 2023. Suddenly I had to travel back to Mongolia to attend his funeral. It goes without saying that my heart was heavy. In fact, I felt deep guilt and shame, blaming myself for ever leaving my father in the first place! It's like part of me died with my parents. These feelings still return during some of the lowest and highest moments in my life. I am still healing from that. Nevertheless, God has been miraculously good to me and, from time to time, gives me good dreams of them both. In our new homeland of Minnesota God has provided us with love and care through our new friends and even gave us a new "adopted" family: mother and father, and home and hope. Indeed, *how good is the God we adore...!*



Prayer League:

After graduating with a Master's degree from the University of Minnesota and working for refugee organizations, I was ready for a full-time commitment! My friend Yulia told me about the World



Mission Prayer League (now known as the Prayer League) and invited me to a Wednesday Bible study in the WMPL Home Office based in Minneapolis. I soon engaged more closely with members of the community through their monthly prayer gathering, "Ask for the Nations". Despite the organization's humble nature, I was deeply impressed with the integrity and virtue of the people I interacted with but I wasn't planning that I would soon become a staff member. Fast-forward, I am here working full-time in the Home Office with program and grants coordination!

I want to express my gratitude to everyone of you who embraced me warmly, advised me generously, encouraged me and welcomed me into your homes, while many of you have warmly smiled and hugged me.

Azuka & Aniraa: My son Azuka started high school this year (crazy!) and my daughter Aniraa is in 4th grade. Azuka enjoys swimming and fishing. He also enjoys other things typical teenagers enjoy, which I work hard to impose limits on! He likes playing chess, and he hasn't yet given up teaching me how to be a better player. He enjoys going to weekly youth ministry and Bible studies. Aniraa enjoys music, songs, and drawing. She misses her friend who moved back to Kazakhstan, but connects with her as much as possible. Aniraa enjoys our church's Sunday school and prays for many things in life. They are both in their journey to have a personal relationship with God. I am blessed to be their mom!



Prayer Requests: As this year wraps up, I have much to thank God for in all the doors both closed and opened. I am grateful for the Prayer League for accepting me into their community.
